Third grade students should complete a minimum of **three activities** based on the choice board below. **The middle box, highlighted in yellow, is a required activity.** The other two activities can be selected from the remaining boxes in no particular order. If you choose to be challenged, complete as many activities as you can during summer vacation. Feel free to complete an activity multiple times, as repetition reinforces learning.
